Tip of the Month: One of the parts of the game that helped Tim get back to the PGA Tour was his bunker play! He is #1 out of 154 players on the Korn Ferry tour at getting out of the bunkers and into the hole in two shots. So below are a few tips to help us be like Tim and get out of the bunkers more successfully!

#### **BUNKER SHOTS:**

- 1. Play the ball off your left heel –just like your driver.
- 2. Open the club face so that the lines on the club face are pointing towards the toes of your left foot (like photo below). I know that having the club face like this is scary and looks wrong but in order for bunker shots to fly high, over the face of the bunker and onto the green, it MUST look like this!!
- 3. Hit about 6 cm behind the ball. Make sure you follow through just as you would in a normal shot bottom picture (Timmy) !!!





#### **KEY MOVE**

4. Hit the sand with enough force to make the sand fly out of the bunker and onto the green – otherwise the ball will not get up and over the lip in front of you !!!

#### **COURSE REPORT**

We are now three-quarters of the way through the year. The past month has been consistent drizzle/rain with no drying days in-between. Drains that we have added or rebored in a couple of areas, are working well. The 15th Fairway has been poor this year as well as the end of the 6th. This has been due to irrigation issues in the summer not allowing these areas to dry. The course for this time of the year has been good.

Greens have great cover and have been a consistent speed throughout the winter, rolling well. Will continue to fertilise and top dress when possible. Tees and Surrounds have a good cover, with coring happening at the end of August, this will help aerate areas going into spring and remove some thatch. Fairways have a great cover also, we have sliced, vibromoled areas to try move water. After all it is winter (a). We have tried to stay on top of the rough growth so players can find their ball and play out of the wet areas more easily. I think that placing through the green has been great.

Congratulations to James Hart and Campbell Devaney that won their finals match in the

McLennan competition, awesome achievement.

To everyone playing in club champs, GOOD LUCK (watch out for the Greenkeepers). To members and visitors, enjoy your golfing month, reach any goals you may have.

Please continue to replace your divots and repair pitchmarks. Be aware of where you are driving/walking, carts are well away from greens and tee areas. We try our best to keep carts available for play, we do our best with the weather.

### **NEW RANGE CART!**

We have a new Club Car range cart here at the MGC. This will be used for the range balls and also for corporate days and other club events.

It is great to have equipment to help get the job done as efficiently and safely as possible

#### **Rules Corner**

This month we will look at a recent incident on our course which required a ruling to ensure the correct procedure had been followed.

The incident involved a player playing the first hole, who hit his second shot into the Camelia bush behind the thirteenth green. The player and his playing partners searched (reportedly for about 1 minute) in and around this bush, including moving and shaking branches and probing the bush without finding the ball. At this stage they abandoned the search and the player was considering his options (proceeding as for a lost ball under Rule 18.1). However, before he returned to replay from the spot he had played his second shot, his original ball was seen to be on the ground immediately under the Camelia bush, apparently having fallen from the bush after the search had been abandoned (but still within the allowed 3 minute search time). The player then proceeded to play this original ball to complete the hole. The player sought a ruling as to whether he was subject to any penalty.

In ruling on this incident, we need to look carefully at Rule 7 and decide whether the actions of the player in searching for the ball were within those allowed in fairly searching for a ball. Under Rule 7.1, the player was entitled to take reasonable actions to find and identify his ball including moving or bending bushes and tree branches. Also under Rule 7.4 there is now no penalty if the ball is accidentally moved in trying to find it, and this includes moving or shaking a tree or bush if the player believed his ball may have come to rest in that tree or bush. However, if a ball at rest in a tree or bush, is successfully dislodged by the shaking, and clearly identified as the player's ball, to avoid penalty, the player would be required to replace the ball in the tree or bush (actual spot estimated if unknown) and then proceed most likely under the unplayable ball rule ((Rule19).

The ruling given in this case was that the player did not incur any penalty. This decision was based on the following:

- a) The player's search actions were deemed to be reasonable and in line with the guidelines of Rule 7.1
- b) The player's search actions did not immediately cause the ball to be dislodged from the bush
- c) In the absence of any other evidence, the ball subsequently falling from the bush was deemed to be the result of "natural" forces not accidentally moved by the player during search
- d) The original ball was found within the allowed 3 minute search time

It is interesting to consider what the ruling would be had the original ball been dislodged from the bush during shaking, and without invoking Rule 19 (unplayable ball) played from its new spot below the Camelia bush. In this case the player would incur the general penalty (2 strokes) for having played from a wrong place – see Rule 14.7


