I know Kiel and the team are, and possibly every golfer is ready for a dry and fine September. But how lucky are we to have at least had the opportunity to play 24 days of golf in August. This has allowed Club Champs Qualifying, Business House Golf and the finals of McClennan and Imlay to be completed. All info of winners and highlights are included in this September update. On behalf of the club members thank you to the Greens team and the Club Captains for the outstanding job they do to let us play the game we love.

Highlights for August for me were...

representing MGC at the Golf Manager's of NZ Conference in Christchurch. This was a fantastic opportunity to learn from, and build relationships with, a number of experienced Managers from around the country. I was so proud to hear the praise and see the respect that our golf club has earned throughout the golf network. Our course, our cafe, our pro staff, our practice facilities, all make us the envy of every club in NZ. Comparatively the Membership fees we pay really are also great value when you consider all of the above - more on Memberships later in the newsletter. Many clubs are facing pressure to diversify income streams to stay afloat and a number of clubs - especially in large urban areas - are very concerned about being able to renew leases or meet the increasing needs of their members. We have a lot to be grateful for; we own the land our course is on and, thanks to the foresight of several generations of committees, members and GM's, our club is ready to embrace the challenges we are about to have in front of us. The general theme from the conference was that Covid has had a massive positive effect on memberships and the amount of golf being played, but with borders opening and discretionary spend possibly reducing, golf has to again up its game to stay in the game.

It was great to bring the team of 32 MGC staff together for a staff meeting at Cacia Birch early in

August. Our focus was on how each of our teams can work together to deliver the Manawatu Golf Club mission and how our roles contribute to the enjoyment and pride our members have in belonging to the club. Kath shook her head at the KFC lunch but it was a great chance for our team to enjoy each other's company and with 5 new full time members it was also a chance to get to know each other in a social setting. Kiel and Kauri combined to take out the MGC Kahoot Quiz and it was lovely to see Chrissy back after a successful hip replacement.

The Events team and Cafe have been super busy in August, we are really pumping and August was close to pre covid levels of numbers. We've welcomed back major corporate events, prize givings and weddings and the cafe was booked out for lunch even when the course was closed. Speaking of events, look out for some pretty impressive Audi's on show on Saturday, 3rd September. We are hosting the regional launch of the new hybrid Audi range so make sure you pop down to see member Dave Tarrant and his team from Robertson Prestige to dribble, or tyre kick, around these amazing machines.

VP and Course Committee Chair Grayson Joines has drafted a great summary of the course plans over the next year, and a major infrastructure irrigation project that is on the horizon. Whilst the numbers seem scary, this is exactly the type of forward planning our club has a reputation for, and this will see us well placed for the next generation of golfers and members. You may have noticed the first signs of the aforementioned work with the planting of natives along both sides of 15. This is to future proof our course and is a continued commitment to the planting plan to replace trees that are removed with quality natives. Having a plan is one thing, but having Billsy lead the team of planters really makes it a reality. I have to admit that I worked here for a month before I realised that, despite often working 6

days a week, John Bills was not actually a paid member of staff. He represents a huge number of volunteers that give their time and passion for the club so generously. Challenges for me in August include:

- Shooting 85 that included 45 putts in one round
- Putting on 3 kg since starting in the GM role in July, this can be directly attributed to Rocky Road and Cheese Scones.

As one helpful President has pointed out - "Maybe less time in the cafe and more time on the putting green is needed".

Possibly good advice.

I'm also enjoying the challenge of harnessing the enthusiasm of our members and their best intentioned ideas to improve the course. Whether this be murals, planting, course feedback or tree carvings, we have a great process in place to ensure these fit in with our overall strategic plan. Please come and talk to me if you have an idea or a passion project that you'd like to develop.

Goals for September:

- We would like to install a set of recycling bins at the first tee. If there is a member or members who have a building background, or some great practical skills, please let me know as these are onsite and ready to make a difference in terms of recycling and sustainability.
- We are looking for clean fill which will be used once the course is dry to form the mounds (up to 1200mm high) that will cover the area between the 6th tee and 7th fairway. If you know of clean fill available, please let me know.
- Rescheduling the Paths Working Bee to ensure we get on top of the lime paths in particular on 8/9/10th hole - date to be confirmed.

- Continue to increase our engagement through the clubs social media channels (particularly Facebook).
- Hosting a successful Devils Own tourney on Sept 22-25, whilst this does bring a small level of disruption for our loyal members, sharing our course with a group who have had a relationship with our club since 1932, and the revenue they bring, is something we all need to embrace.
- We have a major IT upgrade happening on Monday Sept 5 between 3-5pm, this will take out internet, Eftpos and anything online and is part of a major software and hardware upgrade for the club.
- In line with maramataka Māori, this year Mahuru Māori started on Saturday 27 August. It doesn't matter whether your reo skills stop at 'kia ora', or you can whaikorero on the marae with the best of them, Mahuru Māori is something we can all do. So jump on the waka e hoa mā, and let's give Mahuru Māori our best shot! Over the next month some reo challenges and education will be offered to our members via the MGC Facebook and other events are planned. Kia kaha MGC! For more info go to www.mahurumaori.com/

Men's Craigs Investment Partners August Tankard Sat 6th


On what turned out later to be quite windy, the scoring was very good for the Tankard day.

MESSAGE FROM THE CLUB CAPTAIN

A Friendly Reminder: Returning of Score Cards

As the Club Captain of the Manawatu Golf Club, one of my jobs is to monitor the entry of golf cards by club members after playing a round of golf. This is very important for the integrity of the scoring system as well as the fairness of golfers when playing competitions or matches. Via the NZ Golf Dotgolf Internet Site I can track all Members who play golf.

There seems to have been some confusion in regard to match play cards with some members believing they aren't required to enter cards for handicapping. This is incorrect. The handicapping system requires that scores from all forms of competition, including match play, must be entered for handicapping purposes.

A quick summary of the NZ Golf Club Rules are that "when playing with a partner and have played 12 holes or more, you **must** enter a scorecard".

Please note the full Match Committee playing rules are on the noticeboard in the Cardroom.

Below is an extract from the publicised Manawatu Golf Club Match Committee "playing Rules".

It is very important that you familiarize them for your future reference.

Entry of score cards

Refer to programme book for procedure. The golf club's policy is that the marker enters the players score into the Dot Golf touchscreen. Cards must be entered immediately after the round is completed. In Gross & Net Stroke competitions the Pickup option must be selected on holes where the ball has been pickup (not putted out). If after entering a card this issue is realised, please contact the Pro Shop in the first instance to arrange for proper entry of card score.

Handicap Committee

The Handicap Committee will be made up of the Men's and Women's Club Captain and one other member from the Match Committee.

The Handicap Committee's main functions is to ensure that all members of the Manawatu Golf Club comply with the USGA Handicap System.

The Handicap Committee shall reduce or withdraw the handicap index of players who do not return all acceptable scores, or otherwise do not observe the spirit of the USGA Handicap System. Players who have their Handicap Index withdrawn become ineligible for competitive play.

The Committee may make the penalty and score adjustments without directly notifying the player.



MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

The membership committee has presented its recommendations to the full committee, these include

Engaging the services of a course marshall on a Saturday and Sunday for a trial period of 3 months. This is to ensure slow play is not a deterrent to enjoying golf. Sunday tee times have gone up by 150% over the last 4 years, and Saturdays are also very busy, finding a suitable marshall to ensure play is enjoyable for all, may be the key ingredient to Sat/Sun golf. If you have someone in mind for this paid role, please let me know.

The committee is also considering introducing a Cart fee that reflects the extra wear and tear carts place on the course. This fee (annual for members who own carts and casual for visitors) will go directly to the upgrade of paths. This is not set in stone yet and feedback is welcome from all.

The committee is reviewing the 5 and 6 Day membership options and considering whether these could be replaced by a Weekday Membership (and the full 7 Day membership). No decision has been made on this yet as there are many considerations to consider including the effect this may have on Club Champ numbers, total membership revenue, additional benefits for weekday members and other factors. If you have strong views on this or would like to know more, please speak to James or email your ideas. This won't be in place for the 2023 Membership but is under consideration.

We are very close to finalising the Membership fees for 2023. The F&R committee is determined that these will not be increased beyond the level requiring a Special AGM (10%). However to ensure the financial sustainability of the club we can expect an increase, it is likely that Full 7 Day Membership will be close to, but not above, \$1500; all other memberships will be based on a % rate of the full membership. Whilst this is a significant jump (up from \$1382), it does reflect the current cost of living

crisis we are all aware of and reflects the increased cost of wages and increased costs in all areas of running the course. Our team goal is to ensure the level of service (both on and off the course) increases by significantly more than the cost of the increase of membership - you can hold me accountable to that.

Ideas in place for small improvements in member services include

- A trial early cafe opening on Saturdays. Once daylight savings starts, we have engaged the services of a Barista to offer Coffee from 7.30am in the club house for our early starters or early walkers on a Saturday.
- A trial of a course cafe cart in October to offer drinks and snacks in the weekend
- A continued focus on Bunkers with great progress having been made on #16 (we are delighted with the drainage and the new sand, we still have work to do on the bunker face)
- An increased commitment to our gardens and planting of natives on 15, 10 and 6
- The major work planned between 6/7 to complete the renovation of where the trees were removed.
- A goal for '23 is to improve our practice facilities including opening the grass practice area on the range on Saturdays and developing our pitching and practice areas.
- The introduction of a significantly reduced 'Members Guest' green fee rate to ensure our members can enjoy the course when they play here with their friends.

If you have other ideas of how we can improve the Members experience, please let me know.

COURSE NEWS

With the rain in the past month, I hope that all members & visitors managed to play some golf. With the amount of rain that has fallen, the golf course has held up remarkably well. As we now head into spring, the playing surfaces remain in great condition. Our course team is back to a full strength, Mitchell Proctor is the last man to join. Our team consists of Kiel, Scott, Ian, Steve, Matt, Mitchell & of course John Bills . In the past month we have got the 16th bunker back in play but we have yet to complete the entrance and re turf the right-hand side. Greens have been verticut.

In September out on the course, we will be coring tees & surrounds, topdressing greens, looking to spray for weeds, work on bunkers & paths. We do need finer weather which will allow us to get a lot of these tasks done. Please bear with us as we try to work in amongst everyone playing golf causing as little disruption as possible, every now and then you may have to wait. If you can, sometimes it is easier to pick up and move to the next hole.

Please remember to watch where you walk or drive a golf cart, pegs and chains are there for a reason. If you move these to play your shot, please remember to put them back. "Carts this way" signs, please follow them also. When teeing off the 10th Tee, please use the path, donot walk across the 9th surround. Please remember to repair your pitch marks & replace your divots (3), this is for your fellow golfer.

The greenkeepers wish all members & visitors well in their golf game, to all playing matches, play well (3). Let's hope for some finer weather (3) and enjoy!
